CLOSED SESSION MEETING
JANUARY 11, 2010

The Closed Session Meeting of the Moorestown Township Council was called to order by Mayor Roccato at the Library in the New Jersey Room, 111 West Second Street, at 6:00 p.m. Attendance was as follows:

Mayor Roccato read the Open Public Meetings Act statement in full, as printed on the agenda.

Mayor Roccato opened the meeting for Public Comment.

Monique Begg, 209 Parry Drive, encouraged Council to set forth and move forward on goals which would create a safer environment for the community. She indicated that she likes to see a town that is self-contained wherein the residents can walk to the local stores and the children can feel safe. She asked that the Council implement initiatives such as energy conservation so that people are encouraged to walk from place-to-place rather than using a motor vehicle and bringing in little market places such as the old Acme. She thanked Council.
