

**TOWNSHIP OF MOORESTOWN**

**RESOLUTION NO. 109-2017**

**AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF SURPLUS UP ARMORED HMMWV (HUMVEE) VEHICLES TO THE MOORESTOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT THROUGH THE US DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT OFFICE (LESO) 1033 PROGRAM**

**WHEREAS**, the Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 program permits the Secretary of Defense to transfer to local law enforcement agencies property of the US Department of Defense that is suitable for use by law enforcement agencies in excess to the needs of the Department of Defense, including the Up Armored HMMWV (Humvee) vehicles to be used during emergent events such as natural disasters and extreme weather events. The HMMWV (Humvee) vehicles will also be used in the response to active shooter or barricaded subjects, providing protection to both officers and civilians; and

**WHEREAS**, the Moorestown Police Department has determined to enroll in the LESO 1033 program through the New Jersey State Coordinator within the New Jersey State Police Office of Emergency Management and with the Defense Logistics Agency LESO, signing a memorandum of agreement with both agencies agreeing to the terms and conditions of the LESO 1033 program; and

**WHEREAS**, NJ State Senate Bill No. 2364 requires the actual acquisition of surplus property through the LESO 1033 program to be approved by a resolution adopted by a majority of the full governing body.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Council of the Township of Moorestown, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey that the Moorestown Police Department is hereby authorized to participate in the LESO 1033 program and to enter into an agreement with the Defense Logistics Agency LESO to transfer Up Armored HMMWV (Humvee) vehicles to the Department to assist with the protection of officers and civilians in the Township of Moorestown.
