**'Tis the season for leaf collection, so please remember to follow**

- Pursuant to the New Jersey Storm Water Management Regulations, leaves may not be placed of storm drain inlets. Rainfall and melting snow must be able to flow down the street and in
- Never let your children play in leaf piles in or near the street.
- Travel a safe distance from leaf collection vehicles and do not attempt to pass these vehicles
- In an effort to help our crews perform in a safe and efficient manner, please do not park on or if at all possible.

### Please remember,

- There may be times when the quantity of leaves in one area is so heavy that the leaf collect that area. Please be patient. The crews will move into your area as close to the schedule as
- There may also be times when the crews get behind schedule due to the weather conditions
- Street sweeping is part of the leaf collection process. Since the street sweeper moves at a sl the area is clear of all leaves, street cleanup will often take longer than pickups.
