Moorestown is a well-loved town with a location close to Philadelphia and the New Jersey Shore, quaint Main Street, Quaker history and tradition, and excellent Blue Ribbon schools. Moorestown also has fabulous areas for passive (hiking, etc.) and active (organized sports, etc.) activities that are readily available. There are four watershed areas of the Delaware River in town and the community has made great strides to preserve a significant amount of spaces for habitat and enjoyment in each of these watersheds. Whatever type of recreation is chosen, getting outdoors and getting active will almost certainly improve a person's health, well-being, and longevity. - **Wesley Bishop Park** 58.00 acres North Church - paved trails, wooded areas, sports facilities, playground, turf field
- **Lenola Road Athletic Fields** Fields 3.14 acres Lenola and W. Wilson – sports fields, street parking
- **Jeff Young Memorial Park** 9.10 acres Lenola and New Albany – fields, tennis courts, rinks, recreation building, playground
- **Maple Dawson Park** 4.33 acres Maple and Dawson Streets with **Yancy-Adams Park** 0.52 acres Church St. access – courts, playground, fields, and paths
- **Locust Street Park** 4.50 acres Locust with Cedar and Kenilworth – open grassy areas
- **Perkins Memorial & Grounds** 4.61 acres Grounds with specimen trees open to the public, arts center
- **Memorial Field** 26.00 acres S. Church and contiguous to Strawbridge Lake Park and Roberts School - fields, running track, and Veterans Memorial
- **Beech Street Park** 0.75 acres Beech and Mill – grassy area with playground
- **Fullerton Memorial Park** 3.50 acres Zelley, Linden, and E 3rd – Tennis courts, sports fields, playground built by volunteers
- **Stokes Hill** 10.46 acres Main Street near Curtis – sledding hill across from original home of inventor of the “Flexible Flyer”
- **John Pryor Park** 14.27 acres on Salem Road – sports fields, playground, paved trails, dedicated for Moorestown resident and Fallen Hero of Iraq War
- **LeDuc Pocket Park** 0.90 acres Pleasant Valley and Lakeview Roads – park grounds with small hill, have a picnic with the Birthday Nipper
- **Stokes Woods** 2.50 acres on Golf View at Maple – wooded, non-traversable; headwaters of Swede's Run
- **Tiver Avenue** 1.63 acres located off corner of Oldershaw Ave. & Tiver Ave. – wooded area

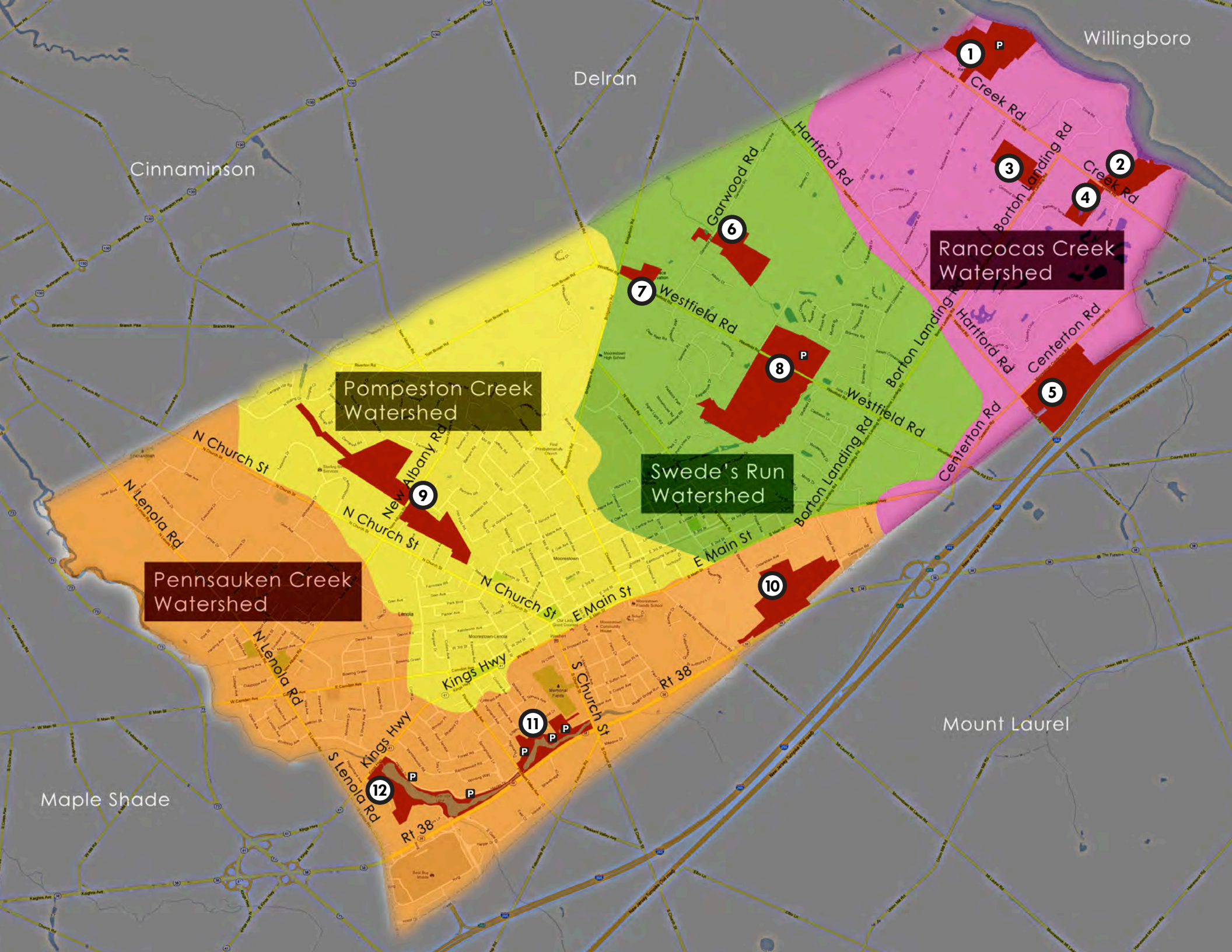

Boundary Creek Park

Located on Creek Rd. opposite Tudor Lane, parking within.

Formerly a peach orchard, Boundary Creek is a Rancocas Greenway and conservation habitat. Upland and lowland forests, fields, tidal wetlands, and the open water of the Rancocas Creek all overlap in this area, preserved by Burlington County. Trails include wooden walkways and wildlife blinds; excellent signage along 1.3 miles of trails.

Farrago Farm

Located on the west side of Borton Landing Rd. near Creek Rd, parking on Borton Landing Rd.

This deed restricted land, open to the public, was preserved by the Giffen family, following the final wishes of True Giffen. Pastured with semi-rugged trails and framed by woods, the area paths lead to almost 300 feet of Kendles Run frontage. Private home at drive's end, non-accessible area; stay to trails.

Community Agricultural Center

Located at 500 Centerton Road near Hartford Rd, ample parking within Burlington County preserved the Winner Dairy Farm and has made this location a hub for local produce and agricultural events. The community gardens are a pleasure to amble through and historic farm buildings maintain the character of Garden State farming at gateway entrance to Moorestown.

Little Woods

Located on Creek Rd. near Laurel Creek Blvd, parking by old Landfill/Composting

Fronting on Rancocas Creek, this area features STEM blazed trails, dramatic creek vistas, old stand beech trees, and an understory of mountain laurels. Named for Silas Little, a former Rutgers botanist, this site is amongst the most scenic in Moorestown and a frequent sighting location for bald eagles. Conservation easement is held by NJ Conservation Foundation.

Susan Stevens-Halbe Preserve

Located on Creek Road across from Little Woods, parking available within

A natural amphitheater is created alongside the stunning lake which also serves as natural runoff area for the Laurel Creek development. The area has sloping terrain and natural trails set amongst the wooded areas; very scenic. This preserve area, offering habitat and visual relief, was purchased by the township along with green acres funding and county funding.

Esther Yanai Preserve

Found on Garwood Road near Albury Court, some parking at preserve edge

Largely wooded, the preserve offers wildlife habitat, wetland areas, and natural trails. The vernal pools found here are breeding grounds for frogs and toads as well as certain unique plants. Enjoy serenity and white tailed deer springing along through the woods in this pristine open space, named for a founding member of STEM.

Wigmore Acres

Located at North-east corner of Westfield Road and Bridgeboro Road, parking is off Westfield Road

STEM maintains the butterfly garden with seating areas at this open space, formerly a garden nursery. The natural trails are under construction but can be explored and will lead to a tributary stream of Swede's Run. Join volunteer efforts to blaze trails here for more hiking.

Pompeston Creek Park

Along Pompeston Creek from Baker School to North Riding Drive

This area offers extensive trails, nature preservation, and recreational opportunities with an "in town" location, not far from our Main Street. With multiple access points, the park extends from Baker School almost to the Cinnaminson border and features streams, natural trails, woodlands, and a large field dubbed, "Square Field" by the local residents. Excellent hiking.

Strawbridge Lake Park

Located between Haines Drive and Kings Highway, and borders along Rt. 38

A gem in our township, this expansive park area offers paved trails, playground areas, fishing and boating spots, large grassy areas and scenic vistas. Appointed as a Works Progress Administration project during the Great Depression, the area was transformed from swamp to man-made lake with attached parklands. The lake areas are visible from the Route 38 corridor offering scenic gateway at Maple Shade and Mount Laurel borders.

Swede Run Fields

Located on both sides of Westfield Road between Stanwick Glen Rd. and Sheffield Drive, parking at Farmhouse/Barn or Ashley Court

Formerly the Benner Farm and actively farmed today, enjoy views of Swede's Run as you take the red trail or the yellow trail, one on each side of Westfield Road. The Farmhouse/Barn, currently under restoration, offers a glimpse of Moorestown history and a photo op spot. Hike the whole property for a 2.25 mile exercise; please stay to trails.

10

South Valley Woods

Contiguous to South Valley School on South Stanwick Rd.

Red-headed woodpeckers and other vulnerable species find a home in this 100 acre woodland area, spanning from Route 38 to South Valley School. Native vegetation is easy to spot along the natural trails with running streams and wetlands throughout. Join STEM in maintaining trails here and at many of our open spaces.



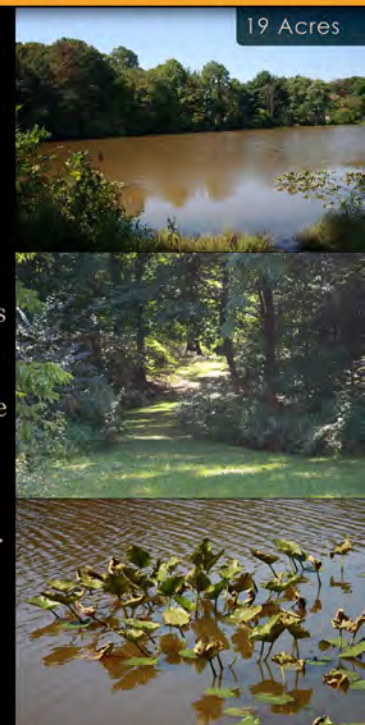

Water Works Woods

Located west side of Strawbridge Lake beginning at Kings Highway and the Waterworks, parking within

Across the lake at Strawbridge Park lies a woodland area with trails, called Waterworks Woods. Find the access trail just over the bridge on Kings Highway on the North side of the lower lake. A series of trails leads you through and offers a hike with a view. Remnants of a community swimming pool and outdoor hearths seen along the trail give a peek at Moorestown's past.
